Dear Neighbors,

I hope everyone had the opportunity to enjoy the recent holiday weekend and reflect on what Memorial Day represents. Now that we have put Spring in the rearview mirror we turn to Summer and upcoming festivities associated with high school graduations and summer break. I'd like to highlight the efforts of Robert "Bob" Keefer in his Grounds Committee Chair role. Specifically, he has made significant ground on getting Dominion to fix our community's watch lights (street lights) and coordinating the refurbishment of the community tennis court (now lined to accommodate pickleball as well). In the coming months we will be undertaking repairs to the Champions Path paver path by employment of a contractor. Soon you won't have to worry about stumbling on high spots caused by roots raising individual pavers, but exercise caution as you travel through the park until repairs are completed.

For those of you that live around the community ponds, please report any issues as soon as you notice them. We need your eyes and ears to help identify conditions affecting the water quality in either biologic growth, or mechanical issues with equipment. Mike Laborte is now the Lakes Committee Chairman and is developing some mechanical measures to reduce noise being emitted by our subsurface aerators (bubblers) in Fisher Lake and Wayne Lake.

Unfortunately, with the arrival of Summer we enter hurricane season June 1st and should review our family emergency response plans. Later in the newsletter you'll see some information on preparation actions, consideration for flood insurance, and knowing your evacuation zone. Please take some time and make sure that you are ready for the possibility of a major hurricane hitting our area. It has been awhile since we were significantly impacted by a storm and cannot get complacent.

We continue to look for additional help in managing/running our neighborhood and ask that you look at our different committees to see if there is something that interests you.

We are still trying to closeout the collection of our annual HOA dues and need the remaining households to submit payment. Timely payments make it easier to run our neighborhood and lighten the burden on your volunteer Board of Directors.


Woods of Tabb Welcoming Committee

ARC REQUEST REMINDER

Before starting any exterior project on your property you probably need to obtain approval from the Association through the ARC approval process. The request form can be found easily on WoodsOfTabb.org and doesn't take long to fill out. Make sure you talk to all of your adjacent neighbors and get their signature before you turn in your form—they are signing that they are AWARE of your proposed project, not that they approve of it. If you have a concern about a project that one of your neighbors has proposed and do not feel comfortable discussing it with them, please contact the Association President @ wothapresident@gmail.com right away!

Projects requiring ARC approval are:

- Sheds and other detached structures to be constructed on your lot
- Fences
- Decks, porches, sunrooms, room additions
- Solar panels
- Swimming pools and hot tubs/spas
- Driveway, sidewalk and patio additions and extensions
- Dog houses/pens
- Any other structure or substantial change to the exterior of your home, your home's footprint, or your lot.

When in doubt, contact our Architectural Review Committee to discuss your project. The ARC is happy to discuss potential plans with you to make sure you are aware of relevant WOTHA guidelines and restrictions. All approval decisions are based on the Association's governing documents with emphasis on maintaining the aesthetic of the neighborhood and limiting visual impact and disturbance to neighbors.

- ***Computers: Desktop and laptop computers, servers, computer monitors, cell phones, computer wiring, desktop printers including multifunction printers or "All in Ones", fax machines, and desktop photocopiers and scanners.
 ***Please note that we can only accept the computer items listed above.
- ► Household Maintenance: latex paint, oil based paint, stains, solvents, glue, varnishes, adhesives
- ► <u>Automotives- limited to</u>: gasoline and other fuels, waxes, gas/oil mixtures, brake fluid, engine cleaner, tar remover.
 NOTE: Motor oil and antifreeze are <u>not accepted</u> at most events since many communities already accept them at no charge. Call or check our website at <u>www.vppsa.org</u> for more information.
- ▶ Lawn & Garden: insecticides, weed killers, pesticides, fertilizers, pest strips
- ► Household Cleaning: cleaners for oven, drain, toilet, septic tank etc., floor waxes, metal polishes, bleach, degreasers,
- Miscellaneous: charcoal fluids, dyes, kerosene, pool chemicals, fluorescent lights up to 8 ft, all compact fluorescents (CFLs), and rechargeable batteries (alkaline batteries are NO LONGER ACCEPTED; please put in your regular trash).

WE WILL NOT ACCEPT:

- X Televisions
- X ALKALINE Batteries
- X Explosives
- X Ammunition or Gun Powder
- X Household Trash
- X Business or Medical Waste
- X Radioactive Products
- X Large quantities of unknown materials
- X We do not have the ability to pump nor will we allow containers larger than 35 gallons

Household Chemical Collection

- Do not smoke
- Do not leave material in hot unventilated areas for long periods.
- When possible, keep products in original container and ensure lids or caps are tight.
- Place items securely in boxes for transport.
- To prevent unfavorable chemical reactions, do not put multiple containers in bags or soft containers where they may spill or break.
- If you have a leaking container, place this item separately in a clear plastic bag, with newspaper or paper towels on the bottom. Secure in an upright position so it doesn't spill in your vehicle.
 Please notify staff that the item is leaking.
- MXI is the premiere service provider for household hazardous waste collection events sponsored by states, counties, and municipalities and provides disposal services at the VPPSA events. With a fleet of permitted vehicles, national network of terminals, staff of highly trained personnel, and a Materials Recovery Facility, MXI offers a full range of recycling and disposal services using the cutting edge of universal hazardous waste management technology.

Computer Recycling

- Since 2001, our contractor, Computer Recycling of Virginia, has erased every hard drive using software that meets or exceeds all industry standards, including the NIST 800-88. Once the wipe process is complete, any hard drive that fails the wipe process is physically destroyed.
- The mission of Computer Recycling of Virginia, Inc. (CRVA) is to place educationally—useful equipment into Virginia's schools and non-profit organizations free of charge, while promoting electronics recycling throughout Virginia.

At the collection:

- A VPPSA employee will ask which city or county you live in, and what materials you've brought. Proof of residency may be required.
- VPPSA staff will unload your vehicle. Please stay in your vehicle unless requested to do otherwise.
- There are separate drop off points for household chemicals and computers.
- Be prepared to identify your materials. If unsure, tell VPPSA staff before they begin unloading.

Alternative Recycling and Disposal Sites

Best Buy accepts computer components at no charge (limit three items per household per day). Computer monitors and televisions are accepted at a \$29.99 charge per item (limit two items per household per day). TVs accepted are tube TVs smaller than 32" and flat-panel TVs - LCD, plasma, and LED - smaller than 50". Mobile phones are accepted at no charge (limit three items per household per day). See www.bestbuy.com/recycling for a complete list of acceptable and unacceptable items that Best Buy recycles.

Batteries + Bulbs accepts rechargeable and alkaline batteries at a charge of \$1.85 per pound. Compact Fluorescent Lamps are accepted at a charge of \$0.66 per bulb. Four-foot fluorescent tubes are accepted at a charge of \$0.53 per tube and eight-foot fluorescent tubes are accepted at a charge of \$0.93 per tube. Items should be loose when taken to the store as they will be weighed/counted to determine the total charge. Batteries + Bulbs accepts unlimited quantities.

<u>Goodwill Industries</u> accepts computer components for recycling at no charge. Goodwill uses a U.S. Department of Defense-grade program on all donated devices to clean hard drives and erase personal and sensitive information.

<u>Home Depot</u> accepts Compact Fluorescent Light bulbs and rechargeable batteries at no charge (fluorescent tubes are <u>not</u> accepted.)
